

Supplier Code of Conduct

Jasmine Technology Solution Public Company Limited and its subsidiaries (collectively referred to as the “Company”) uphold a policy of equitable treatment towards suppliers, prioritizing mutual benefits in all business relationships. The Company, therefore, has established a “Supplier Code of Conduct,” which addresses critical areas such as human rights, labor standards, environmental protection, and anti-corruption measures. This Code also emphasizes adherence to safety and occupational health standards, environmental sustainability, service quality and safety, and traceability. The Company is committed to fostering fair competition, equality, and mutual respect in its dealings with suppliers, ensuring compliance with sustainable business practices as outlined in the Code.

Definition

“Suppliers refer to vendors, contractors, and/or service providers, whether juristic persons or individuals, who supply goods, perform work, or provide services to the Company.”

Scope and Guidelines

1. Compliance with Laws and Regulations

Suppliers are required to comply with all applicable laws and regulations relevant to the business operations. Suppliers must conduct business with integrity, transparency, and adherence to policies, rules, regulations, ethical standards, moral principles, and fairness in all business dealings.

2. Intellectual Property Infringement

Suppliers must not disclose, exchange, sell, or transfer significant business information and/or intellectual property related to the Company or its stakeholders, which they may have access due to their collaboration with the Company. Suppliers must also cooperate in providing written agreements (if requested) to ensure the protection and confidentiality of internal organizational information, even after the business relationship with the Company has ended.

Suppliers must comply with all applicable laws and treaties related to intellectual property and must not disclose or infringe upon the intellectual property rights of others without proper authorization.

3. Confidentiality, Data Protection, Personal Data Protection, and Record Maintenance

Suppliers must maintain confidentiality, protect data, and ensure the security of personal data by implementing adequate and appropriate measures. These measures should safeguard data against unauthorized access, accidental destruction, loss, alteration, or disclosure. Suppliers must also establish and maintain accurate and complete records to ensure accountability and prevent falsification or omission of data that could conceal or misrepresent events or transactions. Data records must be properly stored and securely disposed of when no longer required.

4. Conflicts of Interest

Suppliers must not seek personal gain or provide benefits to close associates from their position, duties, or opportunities arising from working with the Company.

Suppliers must cooperate in disclosing information, transactions, or situations that may present a conflict of interest with the Company.

5. Anti-Corruption

Suppliers must comply with applicable laws and regulations related to anti-corruption, bribery, fraud, and all other forms of prohibited business practices. This includes any acts of coercion or bribery, whether conducting business with government agencies, the private sector, or other public organizations. Furthermore, Suppliers must not offer, promise, or provide any gifts, rewards, or personal benefits that could influence the relationship between the Supplier and the employees of JTS Group.

Suppliers must acknowledge and adhere to the Company's anti-corruption practices and cooperate with all requirements and policies the Company has declared regarding anti-corruption and anti-bribery measures.

6. Responsible Sourcing and Delivery

Suppliers must treat business competitors within the framework of fair competition and refrain from any actions that may negatively affect competitors and the Company.

Suppliers must not seek confidential information from competitors or any other data through dishonest or improper means to facilitate transactions or benefit the transactions between the Company and the supplier.

Suppliers must have measures and procedures in place to responsibly address or rectify any errors to the best of their ability and cooperate with the Company in the investigation when errors in products or services related to the supplier are identified after delivery, which result in damage to the Company and clients.

Suppliers must have contingency plans in place for sourcing goods or services in times of crisis or emergency to minimize operational disruptions. The Company encourages suppliers to responsibly source products and services throughout the supply chain, support the use of locally sourced raw materials or products that meet appropriate quality and standards, and avoid sourcing raw materials or components for production or services from sources involved in illegal activities, human rights violations, or a lack of responsibility toward society and the environment.

Suppliers must encourage their own business partners or subcontractors to comply with the principles defined in this Supplier Code of Conduct, treating them as a shared standard for conducting business together.

7. Respect for Human Rights

Suppliers must conduct their business with respect for the human rights of their stakeholders. Any other relevant human rights principles serve as a guideline for operations, suppliers must operate their businesses without the use of child labor, defined as individuals below the minimum working age stipulated by the laws of each respective country.

Suppliers must not engage in or derive benefits from forced labor and abused labor, including but not limited to threats, intimidation, abuse, human trafficking, or any form of labor exploitation.

Suppliers must recognize the equal dignity of all individuals and operate with equality and fair treatment without discrimination against employees, local communities, vulnerable groups, or other stakeholders. This includes refraining from discrimination based on physical differences, race, nationality, religion, gender, age, education, or any other factors as stipulated under the laws of the countries where the suppliers operate, which remain in effect throughout the term of the contractual agreement.

8. Fair Treatment of Labor

Suppliers must provide fair and appropriate wages and compensation to employees and workers, aligned with the nature and duration of their work. Suppliers must ensure proper rest periods, holidays, leave, and benefits in accordance with legal requirements and deliver them promptly. Suppliers must not employ undocumented workers. In cases of employing migrant workers, suppliers must ensure compliance with the labor laws of the countries where they operate and agree to audits upon request.

9. Occupational Health and Safety

Suppliers must ensure a safe working environment and provide work equipment in compliance with occupational health and safety principles, as mandated by the laws of the country in which they operate. Suppliers must adhere to all applicable laws, regulations, rules, and recognized standards concerning occupational health and safety.

Suppliers must adhere to high standards of occupational health and safety throughout their operations. They must not neglect or disregard any actions or deficiencies in the workplace that may pose risks to employee safety. Suppliers must establish processes for monitoring, recording, and reporting to ensure that work practices promote hygiene, safety, and minimal adverse social impact.

10. Environment and Sustainability

Suppliers must consider the significant environmental impacts that may arise from their business operations or affect their business. They must comply with all applicable laws, regulations, standards, and recognized practices to prevent, mitigate, and minimize environmental impacts to the greatest extent possible.

Suppliers must implement measures to prevent and minimize environmental impacts arising from production, storage, transportation, disposal, and the life cycle of products and services, prioritizing environmental friendliness and considering the potential environmental effects.

Suppliers must exercise environmental stewardship by managing waste and end-of-life products through the efficient and effective use of natural resources to reduce greenhouse gas emissions that contribute to climate change. Furthermore, Suppliers must prioritize sustainable water and energy management, the use of renewable energy, and the preservation of biodiversity within the scope of their business operations.

11. Social Responsibility

Suppliers must treat all stakeholders equitably and demonstrate consideration for the interests of various stakeholder groups, particularly indigenous peoples, migrants, and vulnerable groups residing in areas where the Company conducts its business operations.

Suppliers must contribute to the welfare of society and local communities by organizing or participating in constructive activities in collaboration with the community to enhance the quality of life in a sustainable manner.

12. Business Continuity Management

Suppliers must conduct a business risk assessment, particularly for risks related to employees, production activities, and any risks that may affect the ability to manufacture and deliver products and services, to build understanding and establish appropriate contingency measures for the situation.

Suppliers must inform the Company in the event of an emergency situation that affects the continuity of the Company's business operations.

13. Implementation of the Supplier Code of Business Conduct

Suppliers must promote and support the practical implementation of this Supplier Code of Business Conduct among their employees/workers and subcontractors, in order to create an ethical business environment throughout the supply chain.

Suppliers must communicate and provide training on the Supplier Code of Business Conduct to employees, workers, and subcontractors to enhance sustainable supply chain management.

Suppliers must establish management systems consistent with the Supplier Code of Business Conduct and agree to allow the Company to monitor, inspect, and visit the Supplier's operations (right to audit) to improve cooperation in accordance with the Company's appropriate measures.

Violation of the Code of Conduct

Should suppliers fail to comply with the Company's Supplier Code of Conduct, the Company reserves the right to terminate the business relationship with the supplier. The decision will depend on the severity of the violation and the circumstances surrounding the incident.

Monitoring and Evaluation

The Company encourages partners to provide feedback through various channels established by the Company to gather insights and it will be used to improve collaborative processes and enhance the working relationship.

Review of the Code of Conduct

The Company assigns a responsible party to review the Supplier Code of Conduct annually or when significant events warrant a review. Any material changes will be communicated to stakeholders and presented for approval to the Company's board of directors.

Complaints and Whistleblowing

Suppliers must provide channels for stakeholders to submit complaints and whistleblowing reports, and must establish a transparent, easy-to-understand process for handling such complaints and reports, including measures to protect complainants and whistleblowers.

Suppliers must inform the Company of any situation that may have an impact due to non-compliance with this manual. Any supplier or stakeholder who is affected, or anyone who witnesses such an incident, may report it through the whistleblowing and complaint channels in accordance with the Company's Whistleblowing Policy and Guidelines.
